It is always our desire that all Christians share in the Lord's Table together. You need to know what we believe and confess before showing your agreement as you join us in this communion. As Christ here gives to us His holy body and blood for the forgiveness of sins, those who have no desire to put away their sinful habits should not mock Christ and His gift. As the pastor is the steward of this table, those who do not commune here regularly are asked to speak with the pastor to arrange for a time of instruction before giving their public confirmation of what we believe. If you desire spiritual counsel so that you can commune with repentance and faith, please also arrange for a time to speak with the pastor.

Nominations for Seminary Award... Jan 2025

Anyone in Lutheran Church-Canada may nominate a candidate for the Delta Chi award, given by Concordia Lutheran Theological Seminary, St. Catharines on behalf of the wider church. This "highest and most distinguished award" is "presented to an individual whose life exemplifies service to Christ in his/her everyday living and vocation" in service to the local congregation, the community, the synodical region, the church at large, church service organizations, and educational institutions. Delta Chi refers to the initials of the Greek expression δῖάκονος χριστοῦ which means "servant of Christ". Lutheran Foundation... Did You Know?

Using the Foundation's Gift Allocation Agreement greatly simplifies your estate executor's work, if you're making multiple charitable gifts from within your estate. Estate executors are required to provide each named charity with a copy of the gift clause within your Will, and ultimately have each charity also sign an affidavit attesting to their agreement regarding the estate accounts. Naming the Foundation as the sole charity to receive a gift, then having them disburse the gift per your signed Gift Allocation Agreement, will minimize the executor's work at no cost to the estate, and provide greater privacy regarding your charitable estate gifts.
