As the pastor is the steward of this table, those who do not commune here regularly are asked to speak with the pastor to arrange for a time of instruction before giving their public confirmation of what we believe. If you desire spiritual counsel so that you can commune with repentance and faith, please also arrange for a time to speak with the pastor.

The Season of Lent

Beginning with Ash Wednesday (March 05), the Season of Lent lasts 40 days, in connection with the days and nights of rain during the flood in Noah's time; the time that Moses spent on Mount Sinai receiving the Law from the LORD; and the years of wandering in the wilderness before the children of Israel were permitted into the promised land. These times during which the people of God contemplated the deserved wrath of God upon their sins, and yet His wondrous grace to keep them safe and see them through to a new life, inspire us to take time to focus on the same way in which God deals with us by His grace. Sundays are not included in the 40 day count, as they always remind us of our new life in the resurrected Jesus. So take the time throughout these 40 days to contemplate and exercise your devotion with prayers (including our midweek Lent Vespers), giving of alms (offerings and charitable gifts), and fasting (letting our bodies feel the hunger for God's good gifts). We also continue to hold back our singing of Alleluias and the great Gloria in Excelsis, reserving them for the coming celebration of Easter.

EFC Response to Recommendation to Remove Charitable Status

The Evangelical Fellowship of Canada (EFC), of which Lutheran Church-Canada is a member, expressed concern in light of the parliamentary recommendation to remove the advancement of religion as a charitable purpose and "no longer provide charitable status to anti-abortion organizations." The impact of this change would be far reaching and devastating to all religious charities, to those they serve, and to Canadian society. The EFC reminds Canadians that these recommendations do not have to be adopted. Therefore they encourage strong advocacy as a preventative measure.
